WHEREAS Anne Kesler Shields, born January 27, 1932, in Winston-Salem, remained a lifelong resident until she lost her battle with cancer in October 6, 2012;

WHEREAS Anne Kesler Shields, graduated from Reynolds High School before earning a degree in art from Hollins University, pursuing advanced art studies at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture in Skowhegan, Maine, and the Hans Hofmann School of Fine Arts in Provincetown, Massachusetts, and received a Master's in Fine Arts from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, eventually becoming one of Winston-Salem's most accomplished native-born artists; and

WHEREAS throughout her 60-year career, Anne Kesler Shields worked tirelessly to develop the Winston-Salem art community, helping to found Associated Artists of Winston-Salem and the Winston-Salem Gallery of Fine Arts, which became the Southeastern Center for Contemporary Art where she also served on the board;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby thanks Howard Shields and Family for their generous gift of numerous art works by Anne Kesler Shields and others to the Forsyth County Public Library, and for promoting opportunities for education, art and culture for citizens from all walks of life.
